- Advance rural RD&E through the RDCs
- Provide strategic leadership for collaborative, effective and efficient investment in rural RD&E
- Provide a national coordinated voice on rural RD&E
- Forum for engaging the collective action of the RDCs





Rural Research and Development Corporations

- 15 RDCs servicing many different rural sectors
- R&D investments underpin Australia's:
 - competitiveness
 - profitability
 - sustainability and
 - natural resource base





Improving the system

- Increased coordination and collaboration
 - Across RDCs, RD&E community and government
- Greater engagement and communication
 - To industry, government and community
- Improved efficiency and effectiveness in investments
- Better information and coordinated funding in cross-sectoral areas





National Primary Industries RD&E Framework

- Commitment to strategic, cross-sectoral collaborative investments
- RD&E Framework provides investment in:
 - cross-sectoral
 - cross-jurisdictional
 - cross-portfolio
- 14 sector and 8 cross-sectoral strategies







- Agreed national strategies, combined effort
- Focus on future capability
- More strategic engagement
- Teamwork & collaborative culture
- Large coalitions of specialists
- More stable funding arrangements and new funding models
- Significant new capital investments

- Independent policy think tank and research organisation
