

Park ART

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Henricks Park was formed as a community project instigated by the Community Development Officer, and local artists of Injune district.

Two blocks of land were donated to house the park. 60 willing volunteers from Injune, Roma and Arcadia Valley assisted in the development of the park.

With the labour, expertise and support of the local community, artists and school students, the land was transformed into a work of art.

Funding from RADF, Q150 and the local Council allowed community education in Stone Masonry and Carving, Tiling, Mosaics and Project Management.

Henricks Park, a memorial recognising the bravery of the people who have served their country, is used for many local events, including weddings, musicals, historical celebrations and by visiting tourists.

It will continued to be used for many generations to come.



Rock cutting allowed the men in the district to work and network together. Volunteers ranged from 8 years old to more than 70 years old and included overseas visitors. Some local volunteers travelled more than 150 kms for each working bee.

The final rocks are in place. Donated sandstone and heavy machinery saw the rock work grow over a couple of years
