Combined Foliar trial and CCA meeting. Tomorrow - Thurs 15th February at 4pm

Barry Haskins (Hillston District Agronomist) invites you to have a look at the Foliar fertiliser trial in cotton at Lairds property "Mountview".

### Reminder - Wanted Alive: Large Helicoverpa larvae from Bollgard II plants

(From "The Australian Cottongrower" December 2006 – January 2007 article.)

ACRI is seeking live larvae from Bollgard II of both *H. armigera* and *H. punctigera* that are 6mm in length or longer. Details of sampling, collection and contribution methods are available in the article on page 10 or by contacting Trudy Staines on 0427 480 967 or myself.

"Monitoring Helicoverpa field populations enables the early warning of the onset of resistance and presents and opportunity to refine our resistance management plan to maintain the effectiveness of Bt cotton."

There are some containers and bags at the Griffith DPI office that are available for use. <u>Please keep an eye out for the larvae and send them in if you find any.</u>

#### **Cold Shock Paper**

"Cold Shock" can be a challenge for Southern NSW growers to face and Angela McDowell et.al. have produced a paper examining this area.

The paper states that "cold temperatures of 10°C for 20 nights would be unlikely to result in yield reduction as a result of plant damage".

#### Bt resistance monitoring in 2006/07

The results from the Bt resistance monitoring 2006/07 until end of January have just been released and are available online at <a href="http://cotton.pi.csiro.au/Assets/PDFFiles/RESIST">http://cotton.pi.csiro.au/Assets/PDFFiles/RESIST</a> 06.pdf

There are no results from the southern regions included. However, if we do send in eggs, they will be tested and incorporated into the information dispatched on egg collection.

#### Five easy steps for collecting and dispatching Helicoverpa spp. eggs for monitoring


- 1. Collect leaves with eggs in fields that have not been sprayed with insecticides toxic to *Helicoverpa* spp. during the previous 7 to 10 days.
- 2. Ideally, collect at least 100 eggs per field, but all collections however small are valued.
- 3. Leaves from different fields should be placed into separate paper bags. On each bag record: (a) Date; (b) Location; (c) Crop (please distinguish collections from Bollgard II<sup>®</sup> and conventional cotton); (d) Collector; and (e) Spray History or Last Spray (date and insecticide used). Please include any other information that you consider relevant.
- 4. Keep eggs alive by storing leaves in paper bags in a fridge or esky with a freezer brick wrapped in paper, and deliver them ASAP to your local IDO, district agronomist or assigned co-ordinator. Alternatively, you could post them yourself to Sharon Downes and Louise Rossiter, Australian Cotton Research Institute, Wee Waa Road, Narrabri 2390 (ph: 6799 1500). We can pay for the postage (i.e. tick the 'receiver pays' option on the freight form).
